

## 950 from Gujarat used fake IELTS scores to move to US, Canada

AHMEDABAD: Mehana police's investigation into the irregularities in the IELTS (International English Language Testing System) exams has brought seven centres in Rajkot, Vadodra, Mehsana, Ahmedabad, Navsari, Nadiad and Anand under scanner. Officers told that at least 950 candidates are suspected to have fraudulently secured high IELTS scores this year by paying Rs 14 lakh each. All of them are now either in the US

or Canada. Sources said that the first case of irregularity came to the fore in April when a dummy student was caught taking the exam in Nadiad. Later, it was found that CTVs in two centres were switched off to accommodate dummy candidates in Navsari and Mehsana. A man from Mehsana, who is in the realty business, is the kingpin of the scam, said police sources. The police are using interaction after the TOI, on May 31, reported that illegal immigrants

from North Gujarat needed a Hindi translator in a US court despite having IELTS scores of seven and eight. They had taken the exam in September last year, said police sources. According to the officers, the US consulate general had directed Mehana police to probe the case after which the cops started an investigation. A police officer said that the

scam of issuing IELTS certificates to US and Canada aspirants has been running for nearly five years. The local aides of the human smugglers promise to issue them IELTS certificates with high scores. For this, the out Rs 14 lakh each. The agents who work for the Mehana man collect the money from the aspirants, a police officer explained.

# Hiroshima Day: When "Most Cruel Bomb" Killed Tens Of Thousands

## 6 August Hiroshima Day

The first nuclear weapon was used in August 1945, after World War II ended. Hiroshima Day is celebrated on 6th August every year. Did you ever imagine how devastating the day was? This day is considered one of the darkest days in human's life. Hiroshima Day commemorates the day of August 1945, when an atomic bomb was dropped on the Japanese city of Hiroshima, and a few days later, another fell on the city of Nagasaki. More than 100,000 people, mostly civilians, were killed instantly and for years afterwards, from horrible burns and radiation sickness. Although nuclear weapons were not used against people after that, the USA conducted tests in the Pacific Ocean which involved nuclear and hydrogen bombs. This Day is an opportunity to raise awareness about the threat of nuclear weapons and the dangers of nuclear energy. Today the atomic bombings on the Japanese cities occupy an important place among the most controversial events in the history of humanity. As early as in 1954, Pt. Jawaharlal Nehru, the first Prime Minister of India called upon the nuclear powers to stop the testing of nuclear weapons. U.S.A., U.S.S.R. and U.K., the three nuclear powers of that time a moratorium on nuclear testing during 1958-61. The number of deaths from the direct impact of the explosion varied from 70 to 80 thousand people. By the end of 1945, due to the action of radioactive contamination and other post-explosion effects, the total

number of victims ranged from 90 to 166,000 people. Recognizing that there are enough nuclear weapons to destroy the planet, most nations signed the Non-Proliferation Treaty (NPT), agreeing to prevent the spread of nuclear weapons and work to eliminate them. The world continues to live in the shadow of nuclear weapons. Nine countries have approximately 24,000 nuclear weapons. According to official Japanese data at the end of March 2009, more than 235,000 people have suffered from the effects of the atomic bombings of Hiroshima and Nagasaki. The number of deaths in total is more than 413,000 people (263,945 in Hiroshima and 149,226 in Nagasaki). After more than 30 years of nuclear power plants, there is still no sure way to get rid of the contaminated nuclear materials that are produced. Thousands of nuclear weapons remain on alert, ready to be fired at any time. The world today is in danger of nuclear conflicts.

The Soviet President, Mr. Mikhail Gorbachev, and the U.S. President, Mr. George Bush, signed the historic strategic arms reduction treaty in Moscow in July 1991 in order to reduce their nuclear arsenals by about 30 percent. The signing of the treaty has strengthened the world desire

that the mad race for arms should be stopped as early as possible. It is important to forbid the manufacture and purchase of nuclear weapon or the nuclear power states must reduce and eradicate the weapon.

War Countries remain in a constant state of preparation for war. There is also a danger of nuclear device exploding and annual war erupting because of human or mechanical error. What we need today is world peace and international stability. Unless the countries will follow the policy of disarmament, nothing good can be achieved. Every country wants guarantees of safety and the means of global control for itself. In other words, countries fear that, by giving up their warheads, they will risk to become weaker. The impact caused by the nuclear explosion is frightening. The rigid manner to encourage the reduction of nuclear weapon could be done by an international ban toward nuclear power states.

Today more and more people demand a world without nuclear weapons, and voices are heard. This day has now become a focus for discussions and demonstrations against war and against nuclear weapons. **(B-15) Yash Kishore, Society, Jodhpur Tekra, Satellite, Ahmedabad - 380 015**

# First suspected monkeypox case in Gujarat



**RAJKOT:** A 25-year-old teacher with suspected symptoms of monkeypox has been admitted in the government-run GG Hospital in Jamnagar. The patient, living on the outskirts of Jamnagar city, approached the dermatology department of the hospital on Thursday, with skin rashes and fever.

His samples have been sent to Ahmedabad's BJ Medical College and results are expected in a couple of days. According to the hospital sources, the rashes look 'unusual' but clinical examination could not conclude the reason for lesions. The rashes are bigger than those found in chicken pox patients. However, doctors of the medicine department believe that it's not a case of monkeypox.

When contacted, Jamnagar collector P S Zamsingh said, "The patient has no travel history but as a precaution we have kept him in an isolation ward and sent his sample for testing." Dr Deepak Tiwari, medical superintendent of GG Hospital, said, "The patient has typical skin rashes on legs and other body parts along with fever. It could be any other pox or insect bites too. However, as a precautionary measure, we sent his samples for testing. The symptoms of all poxes are the same, so we do not want to take risks." Medical teams have already started contact tracing in the area near the patient's house.

# Gujarat: Buried alive, thrown in well, baby girls fight back to live



**PALANPUR/VADODARA:** Above all destiny prevails, wise men say. And so would you believe after learning about two newborns - a girl who was buried alive within hours after her birth in Sabarkantha district and another who was rescued alive from a well in Garbada village of Dahod district. But as destined, both survived but are under observation.

Destiny had other plans for the baby girls - both in Sabarkantha and Dahod - as fate soon sent their way rescuers who worked hard to keep them alive. The other newborn girl was rescued from a dry well in Bhe village of Garbada taluka on Thursday morning. She was rushed to the Zydus Hospital in Dahod for treatment.

A newborn girl dumped in a dry well was rescued alive in Bhe village of Dahod district's Garbada taluka on Thursday. According to cops, the girl was rescued after farmer Jakhla Hatla heard her cries. She was rushed to the Zydus Hospital in Dahod for treatment.

The well is near Hatla's house and when he came out for tending to his cattle and crops, he heard the cries. He traced the sound to the well, where he was shocked to discover a newborn crying. Villagers brought the girl out using a basket and rope. The villagers had also informed the 108 services and the infant was sent to the hospital. In-charge police sub-inspector of Garbada police station, U R Damor, said that attempts were being made to trace the parents or the person who had abandoned the girl in the well. Cops are now trying to find the parents of both the infants. The girl who weighed

just one kg with umbilical cord attached is under observation. Talking to TOI, resident medical officer of Himmatnagar Civil Hospital Dr N H Shah said, "The infant, prematurely born at about seven months, had the umbilical cord attached and could not have been more than three hours old when buried. She was buried sometime between 4am and 5am in the field." The horrific tale would have been lost and buried had Jendrasinh Dhobi, who found the infant, missed going to his field located on the Himmatnagar-Shamlaji in Gambhoi village in Sabarkantha district, early on Thursday morning. Upon reaching his farm, Dhobi noticed something writing ominously in the damp soil.

Looking at the rainy season, he was scared that it could be some animal or even poisonous snake and was, therefore, not too keen to venture closer. # LLB student cooks up rape story for extortion



**RAJKOT:** A 22-year-old LLB student fabricated her gangrape story in connivance with her friend to extort money from two in the city. On Wednesday evening, the

woman admitted herself to the Rajkot Civil Hospital and told the doctors that she was raped by two men. Doctors immediately informed the police who recorded the woman's statement. During preliminary questioning, she told police that she had gone to an apartment on Awadh Road on the request of a friend, Rahul. However, she was raped by two men in the flat, she told the cops. A team of Lodhika police and Mahila police station went to conduct an inquest at the spot taking her along. However, when the woman failed to locate the apartment, police got suspicious and questioned her in detail. The woman however confessed that she had cooked up the gangrape story at the insistence of Rahul.

Police inspector K K Jadeja of Lodhika said that

Rahul and the woman were both in need of money and had hatched the plot to frame the two men. The woman came to Rajkot from her native Kalavad in Jamnagar to pursue graduation, albeit against the wishes of her father. She was staying as a paying guest on Nana Hauva Road, but was in a perennial shortage of money as her father did not send her any. Police have closed the case after filing a non-cognizable complaint initially.

# Engineer not a workman, labour court can't hear case: Gujarat high court



**AHMEDABAD:** The Gujarat high court has ruled that an engineer working in a capacity of supervisor cannot be treated as a workman and his case cannot be heard by a

labour court raising an industrial dispute in 2003. The labour court ruled in favour of Parvani in 2006 and ordered the company to pay compensation to engineer in 2007. The company approached the high court questioning the labour court's jurisdiction to deal with a case filed by an engineer, who was working in supervisory position. The engineer also filed a petition claiming back wages prior to 2003. After hearing the case, Justice A Y Kogte said that labour court lost the sight of pay scale and nature of work of an engineer, which would not attract definition of a workman.

# Gujarat: 4 district judges ordered to retire

**AHMEDABAD:** The state government on Thursday asked four district cadre judges to retire prematurely after the Gujarat high court recommended removing them from judicial service. In a notification issued by the state legal department, Rule-21 of the Gujarat State Judicial Service Rules, 2005 was cited to ask four senior judges to immediately retire from service. It said that the HC recommendations have been accepted to pass the order to retire them prematurely "in public interest with immediate effect". The four district cadre judges are Rajeshkumar Modi, currently an additional district judge in Bhavnagar; Avinash Gupta, working as principal judge of a family court in Kutch district; additional district judge Sangita Joshi in Morbi and additional district judge Amrutlal Dhamani in Anand district. Since the retirement is with immediate effect, the legal department clarified that these judicial officers will be given "not less than three months' pay and allowances in lieu of notice period".

The reason behind the order for premature retirement of these four district judges could not be known as the high court's registrar general R K Desai did not respond despite several efforts to contact him. However, sources in the judiciary said the high court last month decided to take action against these judicial officers looking at the low ratio of case disposal by them after a performance review. Meanwhile, following the order for compulsory retirement for four senior judges, rumours were doing rounds in legal circles that 90 judges of the subordinate judiciary have been suspended by the high court.

# Go First's flight returns to Ahmedabad after 'bird hit'

**AHMEDABAD:** Grandhigh-bound Go First Flight G8-911 suffered a suspected bird-hit on Thursday morning minutes after taking off from Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel International (SVPI) airport in Ahmedabad. # From soil and water into veggies: Heavy metals lace green produce



**AHMEDABAD:** The healthy serving of green, leafy vegetables like spinach and cabbage considered central for good health might be laced with harmful heavy metals from the soil in which it's grown and the water it's fed. A doctoral study by Heavy Metals in Soil, Agricultural Product and in Groundwater from Industrially Contaminated Sites of Gujarat by Bhabhus Mohanty at School of Technology, Pandit Deendayal Energy University (PDEU), highlighted higher than permissible levels of metals such as lead and nickel in vegetables samples from Ahmedabad city. The study was conducted under guidance of Dr Anirban Das, associate professor at PDEU. The study mentioned that the soil and groundwater should also be checked as sources of heavy metals in vegetables. The study by extension mentioned that the soil and groundwater should also be checked as the sources of the heavy metals in vegetables such as brinjal, tomato, cabbage, cauliflower and spinach. The study took samples from Gaspur, Visapur, Kasindra, Saroda and Khada villages around Vasa sewage plant. The study highlights the concentration of heavy metals such as copper, manganese, nickel, lead and zinc in wastewater exceeding permissible values by Indian and World Health Organization (WHO) standards. Zinc concentration was found to be the most prevalent heavy metal followed by manganese and copper. Due to the use of

cadmium, lead and chromium in cabbage, beans, chili and brinjal in Rajkot, and arsenic in soil and arsenic and nickel were found in spinach, radish, tomato, chili and cabbage in Vadodra, said Dr Mohanty, now a faculty at a city-based university. The study suggested soil washing technology by using chelating agents and surfactants for the removal of heavy metals. More efficient treatment of the wastewater - which is sometimes used for irrigation in farms - is also suggested as a possible remedy to reduce the heavy metal content in human body cannot process heavy metals effectively due to its high molecular weight. Kidneys can't eliminate it through normal processes and thus it starts accumulating in the body, said Dr Mohanty. "It's a city-based toxicologist. It spreads in parts of the body such as the liver, bones and brains and hampers its normal functioning." The study indicated harmful effects of nickel and lead as insomnia, hypertension, reduction in fertility and damage to neural and renal systems.

# Rajkot Municipal Corporation's 'returnable' cloth bag a win-win idea for all



**RAJKOT:** Still forgetting to carry your 'jhola' from home while heading to the market? Don't worry, you are not the only one. There are many others who are still struggling to get accustomed to the ban on Single Use Plastic (SUP) bags, particularly rampant in the vegetable market. It has now become commonplace to see customers and vendors squabbling over these bags. Looking at this peculiar inconvenience, the Rajkot Municipal Corporation (RMC) is coming with an unique idea to deal with the situation and provide bags to people who need these and also for free. While the central government

increased the micron level of carry bags in order to make these more environmentally friendly, the upshot is that these revised bags are now expensive and vegetable vendors can't afford to keep any. Even in the past, the RMC had distributed such cloth bags at various vegetable markets to the customers but there are some regular offenders who would almost never bring their own bags. Again, if a vegetable vendor charges them for the bags, it triggers a verbal spat on the spot. To find a permanent solution to this vexed problem, the RMC, which has over 100 vegetable and fruit hawker zones in various plots in the city, will distribute cloth bags having RMC logos to vendors in such zones. The hawkers will be told to collect Rs 15 per bag from the customer who requires a bag. The customer can return the bag to any hawker of any such zones out of the 100 designated hawker zones and get a refund of Rs 15. The civic body is also mulling to invite advertisements on these cloth bags to reduce its price. Nilesh Parmar, environment engineer of RMC said, "We are in talks with some NGOs to execute this idea. We are planning to implement this scheme first in all our hawker zones. After learning about all the practical problems, we are mulling to implement this scheme with various grocery stores in the second phase. It's a win-win scheme for everyone."

The bag will continue to change hands, and at the end, the RMC will also come up with an idea to collect worn bags and pay some amount to the vendor after the bag becomes unusable.

# Extra admission rounds for commerce, arts

**Ahmedabad:** The Gujarat University will hold an extra round of admissions to commerce courses to accommodate students who cleared Class 12 supplementary exams. The Gujarat Secondary and Higher Secondary Education Board (GSHSEB) on Thursday announced the results of the supplementary exams. The university, which is currently conducting the third round of commerce admissions, announced that the students who have cleared their Class 12 supplementary exams and those who have not secured admissions after the third round will be able to apply in the extra round. Students will be able to register themselves starting from August 5; the application deadline is August 15. Students who had registered earlier but have not secured admissions after the third round will have to register again. They will be required to submit physical documents and pay fees by August 17 to 24. The university will announce the additional round merit list on August 24. Those who secure admissions will be required to submit their original documents and pay fees by August 25.
